The children love to sing the continents song and can now name all 7 continents in size order!





about being Eco-Warriors! We have looked at what is causing climate change and found out some surprising facts (including how cows and sheep produce methane hint, it's a bit smelly!) We have gone deep down into the oceans to see how we are affecting the wildlife in them and we've been exploring lots of different ways that we can all help to save our planet. Our English unit has been writing persuasive letters and we used this opportunity to write to Boris Johnson to persuade him to take action on climate change now before it's too late. We've also been really busy in our French learning, learning the French for different foods and how to ask for what we would like for breakfast and sandwiches.

This half term year'1 have had so much fun!

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We were lucky enough to have 2 ladies come to visit year 1 and talk to us about what firefighters do, how they can help us and different ways to keep safe near/around a fire.

Our topic this term is Sensational Safari. At the beginning of our topic we went on an exciting safari hunt around school to see what animals we could find. The children did a great job searching for the animals!

In PE we have been practicing out ball skills. We have been working in pairs and practicing how to control the ball and pass the ball using a bounce pass and a chest pass. We really enjoyed a session with Mr Ruparelia who came to into school to do a fun session with us too!

This half term we have been back to forest school. As part of our Geography and science learning, we have been exploring Africa, safari animals, minibeasts and their habitats and food chains.

## Year 1 & 2 Visit to Twycross Zoo


Year 1 and 2 had the best day out exploring Twycross Zoo! We were lucky enough to meet a very knowledgeable man called Finn who taught us all SO much about all the animals we seen. Here are some of things he taught us about each animal; where they come from, how they survive, what they eat and what they enjoy. We got to see meerkats, giraffes, tigers, chimpanzees, penguins, snow leopard, gibbons and zebras.





In year 4 we are thoroughly enjoying learning about The War of the Roses. We passed 'the crown' between the Houses of York and Lancaster to understand why the country was divided. We've developed our sketching skills through carrying out still life sketches of roses and also drawn some fantastic portraits of Richard III. We all had a fantastic time at Bosworth Battlefield and learnt so much. Following our trip we located where we had been on ordnance sur-

vey maps and learnt about grid references and keys and map making. We've done some great narrative writing based on our class novel 'The Fox and the Ghost King' and have now begun work on newspaper recounts.



In science, we have been learning about sound. We've observed how sounds are caused by vibrations by observing what happens when we bang a tuning fork and put it and also what happens to rice when we bang a drum. We've explored how sound travels and how pitch can be varied depending on the size of the resonating chamber.

As always, we have been working hard in maths and been learning about multiplication and division.
