55 BC	Attempted invasion of Britain by Julius Caesar
42 AD	Successful invasion of Britain by Aulus Plautius for Emperor Claudius.
60 AD	Rebellion led by Boudicca, queen of the Iceni.
200 AD	Christianity introduced to Britain.
410 AD	The end of Roman rule in Britain.

The Romans originated from Rome in Italy.

Vocabulary	Definition
Emperor	The Roman Emperor was the ruler of the Roman Empire during the imperial period.
Gladiator	A gladiator fought to entertain Roman audiences.
Conquer	To overcome and take control of people or land using military force.
Invade	Enter a place or land with the intention of occupying it.
Empire	A group of states or countries ruled by the Emperor.
Amphitheatre	A large, open air arena, usually circular.
Colosseum	The oval amphitheatre in the centre of Rome.
Amulet	A piece of jewellery thought to be blessed to protect its owner.
myth	A traditional story of a widely held belief
Mosaic	A picture made up of tesserae (small block).

Roman legacies	
Aqueducts	Raised channels carrying fresh water over long distances.
Latin alphabet	<p>A B C D E F G H I J K L M N O P Q R S T U V W X Y Z</p> <p>a b c d e f g h i j k l m n o p q r s t u v w x y z</p>
Democracy	A way of governing that depends on the power of the people.
Christianity	A religion based on the teachings of Jesus Christ.
